Most fires in these areas are caused by...

- Carelessly discarded smoking material.
- Camp fires not being completely extinguished.
- Broken glass and discarded bottles, which magnify the sun's rays.
- Barbecues being set up too close to, or emptied onto, dry grass and bushes.

Follow the countryside code. Please treat the outdoors with respect and...

- Do not light barbecues or open fires. They are illegal on protected moorland areas.
- Ensure smoking materials are completely extinguished.
- Place all your litter in a bin or take it home with you.
